11559 - Ruling on greeting a non-Muslim teacher

the question

Is it permissible to greet a non-Muslim teacher in the classroom or outside?

Detailed answer

It was narrated that the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) said: "Do not initiate the greeting to the Jews and Christians." (Narrated by Muslim, Kitab al-Salam). The Jews used to pass by the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) and say "Alsaam 'alaykum" meaning death. So the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) told us to say "Wa 'alaykum (and also to you)." (Narrated by al-Bukhaari, Kitab al-Adab; Muslim, Kitaab al-Salam).

So you should not initiate the greeting, but if he greets you and initiates the greeting, then say, "Wa 'alaykum." But Ibn al-Qayyim (may Allah have mercy on him) mentioned in Ahkaam Ahl al-Dhimmah that if we know for sure that a kaafir has said "Al-salamu 'alaykum," then we may say, "Wa 'alaykum al-salam."
