

# 145626 - A late-payment penalty was stipulated in the event of late payment of rent by the tenant

## the question

I live in America, and the way houses are rented here is that the tenant pays the rent at the beginning of each month. But if you are late and delay payment beyond the stipulated period for paying rent, the owner will penalize you by charging a specific amount of money as a result of the delay. The value of this penalty may be mentioned in the lease. My question is: is this extra amount regarded as riba? If I manage to pay the rent every month without incurring this penalty, am I regarded as having got involved in riba even though I have been paying rent on time?

#### **Detailed answer**

### Firstly:

If someone rents a house and the contract is signed between him and the owner of the house, then the money paid as rent is regarded as now belonging to the owner of the house from the time the contact was signed, if he allows the tenant to make use of the property (that is, he lets him move in and live in the house). Thus the rent money becomes a debt that is owed by the tenant to the owner of the house.

Ibn Qudaamah (may Allah have mercy on him) said in *al-Kaafi* (1/279): If [the landlord] rents out his house for a certain number of years in return for an agreed sum of money, that amount of money becomes his from the time he signs the contract with the tenant; it becomes subject to zakaah after one year has passed, and it comes under the rulings on debt. End quote.

Based on that, once the rent becomes due as a result of signing the contract, it becomes a debt owed by the tenant, so it is not permissible for the owner of the house to stipulate that



the tenant must pay interest or any additional amount in the event of his delaying payment beyond the deadline, because this comes under the heading of riba, which is haram.

## Secondly:

If the contract includes a condition stipulating payment of a penalty in the event of late payment of debt, this is a haram contract and it is not permissible to enter into it, even if the individual is certain that he is able to pay on time, because that is approving of riba and making a commitment to it, which is haram. Moreover, something may happen to him that prevents him from making the payment, such as illness, travel and the like.
